
Seeking to find new solutions and strategies to end homelessness as we know it, United Way of Broward County and the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance created the Broward Business Council on Homelessness, which supports a joint initiative called United We End Homelessness. In a collaboration with the City of Fort Lauderdale and Broward County, homeless residents of the downtown Fort Lauderdale encampment were housed and provided supportive services. To date, 90% of those housed remain in their homes.

 Still, there are more than 2,800 homeless people in Broward County.


