Let's Say	Instead of
✓ Substance Use Disorder	✗ Substance abuse / drug habit
✓ Person with an addiction / with a Substance Use Disorder	Addict, junkie, druggie, alky, alcoholic
Person in recovery / in remission	Ex-addict, abstinent, clean, sober, used to be addicted
✓ Has an addiction / dependence	Suffering from an addiction, battling booze
✓ Not engaged	✗ Non-compliant
✓ Medication is a treatment	X Medication is just another addiction
✓ Lapse / reoccurrence	X Using again, fell over, off the wagon
✓ Positive urine drug screen / drug test	X Dirty urine / dirty drug test
✓ Treatment / Intervention	X Rehab
✓ Intoxicated	Drunk, pissed, stoned, out of it, wasted
✔ Distressed, agitated	Crazy, off his / her rocker, lost it, acting out
✓ Person disagrees	X Denial
✓ Resourceful	✗ Manipulative
✓ Recovery residences	X Sober homes
