For example, more than 65% of Veterans struggle with translating their military skills and experiences in a way hiring managers can understand. Veterans also self-report an underemployment rate, which is up to 30% higher than civilians. As a result, Veterans are twice as likely to become homeless during a crisis and experience homelessness twice as long as non-Veterans. These are just a few of the difficulties facing our Veterans.

To improve program gaps and disjointed services to Veterans, United Way of Broward County created MISSION UNITED.

MISSION UNITED provides comprehensive care to U.S. Veterans, Military Personnel and their families who live in Broward County.

MISSION UNITED provides this critical support through a 24-hour hotline (954-4-UNITED) and via the website MissionUnitedBroward.org. Veterans or family members get connected to a dedicated case manager who evaluates their needs and works with them to ensure they receive the services they have deserved.

- Since inception, 20,000 Veterans and their families have been provided services by case managers at MISSION UNITED
- Over 8,000 Veterans have received pro bono legal services, valued at a total of \$7 million

- More than 2,000 Veterans and their spouses have received employment services to increase financial prosperity
- Behavioral health services have been provided to more than 2,500 Veterans and their families through MISSION UNITED and funded partners

HOW YOU CAN HELP
