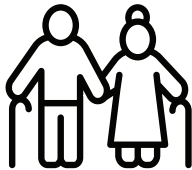

## **More than 50% of Broward County residents are surviving near or below federal poverty.**

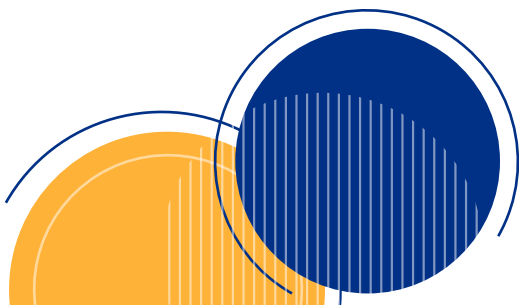
People are working hard, but still struggling to afford essential needs – such as rent, utilities, food, childcare, healthcare, and transportation.

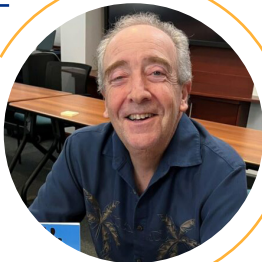
